The Supreme Court is working on a final decision on the West Virginia v EPA case, leaving many of us to wonder about the future of government regulated climate protection... It brings to mind how frontline communities, who are already marginalized socially and economically, will face the repercussions of the Supreme Court ruling.



Frontline communities already bear the worst and the first of climate change. They are the communities that live in areas that experience statistically higher rates of pollution and other disasters such as flooding. If the Clean Air Act is not protected, it will negatively impact the frontline communities already subjected to harmful emissions.

Interfaith Power and Light works on projects that encourage communities of faith and conscience to uphold their values and work towards a cleaner future. It also works directly with frontline communities to advocate for their communities and help them build their resilience to the effects of climate change. Creating emergency resiliency hubs where people can go during blackouts, extreme weather, and smoke from fires is just one of the many ways IPL is on the ground working with frontline communities.

But the work as communities of faith and conscience is only part of what needs to be done. We need to make sure that the Clean Air Act is protected and the EPA enforces these regulations that protect our planet. This is why IPL has been working with partner organizations and mobilizing people to rally for the protection of the Clean Air Act. We must make our voices heard. It is through advocacy, organizing, and voting for pro-climate solutions that we see the changes needed to heal our Sacred Earth.
