
We are thrilled that so many of the girls have chosen to stay in a faith-filled environment for high school next year, and will continue to deepen their faith as they prepare for college and their futures.

Plastics are one of the greatest threats facing our oceans today. Every year, an estimated 33 billion pounds of plastic enter the ocean. Right now, it's nearly impossible to avoid single-use plastics.

As consumers, we shouldn't have to contribute to the ocean pollution crisis every time we need to purchase food, household items, or other goods. The problem with single-use plastic is clear: Companies produce too much of it. And the worst part? Recycling can't fix this as only 9% of all the plastic waste ever produced has been recycled.

That's why Oceana campaigns to stop plastic pollution at the source, by calling on companies to provide consumers with plastic-free alternatives and pushing for legislation that will address the plastic pollution crisis to protect our oceans, marine life, and all those who depend on a clean and healthy ocean. And we're making real progress. Last month, the Biden administration announced a series of actions to help our oceans - among them the phase out of single-use plastics in all 423 national parks. And California passed the boldest single-use plastic source-reduction policy in the United States.

Together, we can turn the tide for plastic pollution.


