Below is an excerpt from a recent JPIC Roma communication.

2023 will mark the 50th anniversary of World Environment Day after it was established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1973. The world Environment Day is celebrated on June 5th and it is a global platform for raising awareness and taking action on critical environmental issues. It serves as a reminder of our collective responsibility to protect and preserve the planet we call home.

It is time to change how we produce, consume and dispose of the plastic we use. Today we produce around 400 million metric tons of plastic waste every year and less than 10% of it is recycled. An estimated 19-23 million metric tons end up in lakes, rivers and seas.

This presentation (which is attached to Bridges) is an attempt to create awareness on the issue of plastic pollution on the occasion of World Environment Day 2023 and the ways and means we can respond to this situation.



BORDER MINISTRY - San Diego, CA

Sr. Natalia and I continue to purchase and deliver men's pants, a non-existent donation item, to Catholic Charity's shelter each week. The Border Patrol brings eligible asylum seekers to the shelter several times daily. The migrants are tested, treated for/or vaccinated for COVID, given a set of clean clothes as available, and cared for until they are sent to their



sponsors which may usually take just a couple of days. When Sr. Natalia and I prayed with a single mom and her 3 children ages 3, 5 and 9 we listened to her story, all prayed simply together and gave her a rosary and psalm to accompany her on her long journey. When I pulled a stuffed animal out of my backpack, the little boy who remained close to his mother finally smiled and hugged his new companion. The other children quickly returned to the door and jumped for joy. It's such little things - listening, praying, companioning - a transforming experience for us.

We also purchase food, food items and pick up clothing donated by the SHCJ's for 'Cookie' who has a small facility across the border near the border wall. Sr. Ann Durst, SHCJ assists her and the asylum seekers with lawyers from Casa Cornelia Immigration Law in San Diego. Cookie helps the migrants and those deported from the US. She has seen the Mexican police approach those deported walking back into Mexico and actually take their money. She rescued one man by telling the police she was waiting for this man to help her at her facility. Thank God, the police knew

her and left. The police, gangs and cartel are very powerful in Tijuana. Please pray for Cookie's son who was shot south of Tijuana a week ago.

All of us sisters working with different aspects of the migrants' needs on both sides of the border have formed our Sisters' Collaborative. We meet on Zoom each month and discover how we can help one another. Sr. Maryanne Loughry, RSM from the UISG Migrant Project has met with us on Zoom and in person to see how we can connect with other hubs of sisters working with migrants around the world who are not as well established as we are. She looks forward to supporting us in a migrant ministry to the most vulnerable and marginalized, a ministry that is increasing every day.

BRONX FJM MEETING - June 17

A small group of FJM members met on Saturday, June 17th, 2023 to "pause awhile" to reflect on our journey of 22 years as a FJM group. We recognized that our members began or joined at various times during these years; some members moved out of the area and others were called to their eternal home by our God.



We began by reviewing the history of RJM lay association and the decisions made at both the RJM General and Provincial levels to incorporate our lay sisters and brothers as companions on life's Journey.

The members noted several positive aspects of our meetings, the companionship, social interaction and the time for reflection, as well as the focus on spirituality and social justice. Mention was made of various topics covered during these years including; Ignatian spirituality, forgiveness, Vatican II, immigration, capital punishment, Catholic social teaching, human trafficking, care of the earth, RJM's missions around the world. These were presented either by guest speakers (RJMs and others) or by video presentations followed by discussion and conversation. We also made use of many RJM resources including Claudine's Letters, Sr. Janice Farnham's research and reflections, and "The Journey Makes Us One," (a favorite)! Retreat days were appreciated, as well as an outing to Ellis Island.

We acknowledged the outreach that the FJM began over 10 years ago—to undertake a "tag sale" to raise funds for our RJM Haiti Mission. Because of this commitment both of FJM members and many donors who give items to sell, over \$42,000 has been raised and sent to the RJM Haiti Fund. Thanks to Alba Sanchez who heads the St. John's/Visitation Flea Market, we have had access to 2-3 tables monthly and our donors have contributed generously.

We have indeed been blessed in so many ways!
