

# "DAWN FOR HAITI" CONCERT - Madrid, Spain

#### **DC Catholic Coalition**

USA-Haiti Province has joined the DC Catholic Coalition. The Coalition is made up of several Catholic organizations who have a base here in DC and are interested in potentially advocating at the federal level for JPIC issues (the list of members is below). Most notably, the Coalition helped to coordinate an advocacy event at the Capitol for the Haitian people on September 21, a National Day of Action in Support of the Haitian People. The province was listed as a sponsor of the event, in which Haitian-Americans, religious leaders, local elected officials, and friends of Haiti in Washington, DC and across the U.S. to called on Congress to stand with the Haitian People by:

- Helping restore democracy in Haiti by ending U.S. support for the corrupt and antidemocratic regime ruling Haiti and supporting a Haitian-led transition
- Helping restore security in Haiti by stopping the flow of weapons and sanctioning collusion between gangs and Haitian elites
- Helping fight rising hunger in Haiti by supporting local Haitian farmers
- Helping end abuse and discrimination against Haitian and other Black migrants

### **Protesting Deportations to Haiti**

The Province JPIC Committee signed on to a letter, directed to the Secretary of Homeland Security, calling on our government to suspend deportations to Haiti. The letter is attached to Bridges.

### Advocating for Haiti Food Sovereignty

The Province Leadership Team signed on to a letter to Members of Congress asking that annual appropriations for USAID to Haiti realign this assistance with the urgent needs of local Haitian farmers, so they can play a leading role response to hunger in Haiti. The letter is attached to Bridges.






# SEPTEMBER BIRTHDAY PARTY - Wellesley Hills, MA
