





**St. Claudine Thévenet's instinct was to** *gather friends* **to live out the mission God gave her.** She sought to meet injustice by tending to the needs she saw in the broken world around her. Claudine and her small group of companions in faith came to see that serving the needs of the people around them was their means of responding to God's merciful love.

Now, for over 25 years, the RJM sisters and many volunteers and partners have been building communities of mission in several parts of Haiti. Starting in 1997, religious and lay volunteers have joined the people of Haiti in *Gros Morne, Jean-Rabel*, and *Port-au-Prince* to create and sustain schools, early childhood programs, youth ministries, health care services, and adult training, while also supporting environmentally sustainable agriculture and helping women and others in need find sustainable and dignified work.

What the Religious of Jesus and Mary have done in partnership with the Haitian people has only been possible because friends, *like you*, have responded to God's merciful love in their own ways and have joined Claudine's community in mission. Through prayer and reflection, the USA Province of the Religious of Jesus and Mary discerned a call to explore carrying St. Claudine Thévenet's mission and spirituality to Haiti. Bearing the hope of the entire province, Sisters Pat Dillon, Jackie Picard, and Vivian Patenaude established the RJM community in Haiti in 1997 and they were soon joined by sisters from around the world and lay volunteers, especially young people.

For more than 25 years, the RJM community has partnered with religious from other congregations and professionals from aid organizations to establish and coordinate ministries with the people of Haiti that seek to develop sustainable local resources and to address the complex needs faced by the people, especially children and young people.





As of 2023, USAID classifies Haiti as facing a complex emergency situation with the estimated 11.7-million-person population facing the ongoing effects of natural disasters (earthquakes, floods, landslides, and epidemics) while also facing the effects of crime, violence, and political chaos. USAID predicts: Nearly 4.4 million people are expected to face crisis or worse levels of acute food insecurity through February 2024 due to high inflation, low agricultural production, and violence.

## Together with some of our friends ...

The USA-Haiti Province seeks to raise \$225,000 by September 2024 to continue the over 25 years of RJM presence and mission in Gros Morne, Jean-Rabel, and Port-au-Prince, Haiti. We seek to make Jesus and Mary known through ministries that support the lives of the Haitian people and develop their resources. Your donations help to cover the ongoing expenses of our sisters and companions in mission who work to lead and sustain:

**EDUCATION** and **FAITH FORMATION MINISTRIES** including schools, early childhood programs, afterschool and youth programs, informal education projects, and educational efforts to support a sustainable environment, agriculture, and dignified economic self-sufficiency.

**HEALTH and WELLBEING MINISTRIES** including a mobile clinic, nursing care, coordination of visiting international medical providers, referrals and financial support for local medical services, a prosthesis clinic, and a residence for elders with no homes.

**NUTRITION, AGRICULTURE, and ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT MINISTRIES** including food distribution, financial assistance, agroforestry, gardens, and small business loans.


