### CELEBRATING ST. CLAUDINE'S FEAST AROUND THE PROVINCE

On February 3<sup>rd</sup>, RJM's and their associates around the world will be celebrating the Feast of St. Claudine. Here in the USA-Haiti Province, some communities have shared their plans for that day.

The **St. Tim's** sisters, who have been praying the novena prepared by the Angelique community in Lyon, will be having a special Mass with Fr. Robert Marciano, Pastor of St. Kevin's, where Sr. Priscilla serves as a foster grandparent. Those at **Marillac** will gather for prayer and sharing, using parts of the Angelique novena.

Our **New Yorkers** will hit the road, as sisters from Yonkers and Highland Mills bridge the almost 50-mile distance between them to meet and celebrate at a designated mid-point. In California, the **La Casa de Esperanza** community has planned an evening prayer reflection, with each one bringing a reading, song or scripture passage that highlights Claudine's life.

The schools in the **Jean Rabel** area will be celebrating the feast on Friday. After Mass on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, RJM's will gathering with friends for a breakfast together.

On Wednesday, the Jesus-Mary Parish School student body in **Gros Morne**, **Haiti held** a "Life of St. Claudine" contest and performed two skits from Claudine's life, beginning with Fr. Coindre's discovery of the two little homeless girls in the church doorway whom he brought to Claudine. The first photo below is taken from a video, attached to *Bridges*, of the children singing. The second photo is of St. Claudine and children praying. In next week's *News Notes* there will be additional photos of the Jesus-Mary celebrations.

The declaration calls for human rights-based social systems, ensuring equal access to healthcare, education, digital technology, affordable housing and food, as well as debt relief, access to a healthy environment, and equality before the law.

Sr. Jean Quinn, DW, Director of *UNANIMA*, will be presenting the declaration Monday, February 5<sup>th</sup>, when the session of the UN

### CHILD SAFETY SEMINAR - Jean Rabel, Haiti

Twenty-four school staff members attended a child Safety seminar, led by Michel Joseph Mertil. It was the first seminar of its kind in which our newer staff members had the opportunity to attend and participate. Others who had attended before, were happy to discuss and share their experiences.

Children in this area, and indeed in all Haiti, are very vulnerable. Their parents have often to leave them in the hands of a grandparent, or other relative, as they themselves seek work elsewhere. When the parents are unable to provide for all their children, one or more are given to another family as a servant. Depending on the adoptive parents, they may be well looked after, or maltreated.



Anyone coming to work in our schools, is asked to attend this course and sign a document that declares that they will do all in their power to ensure the safety of the pupils in the schools. The phone number of a contact person, Miss. Sherline, is given to them, should there be concerns about a child or adult. Miss. Sherline then follows up with family and doctor when necessary.


