
## INTERNATIONAL DAY - Thevenet Montessori School


## MASS OF REMEMBRANCE - Wellesley Hills, MA

While we in the region have offered help (tutoring, legal advice, assistance with some medical issues, financial aid), it is their perseverance and hard work that have made the difference in the family coming to the place they now inhabit. Every member has a green card: the father of the family is taking a course in HVAC repair to increase his job opportunities; his wife is continuing English studies for the same reason; the children are doing well in school. The older son is now in junior college, and his sister, with the help of support from Regina graduates, is in honors classes at Seton High School.

As we anticipate the possibility of increasingly harsh and restrictive immigration policies, it's important to see the human face of what is admittedly a complex issue. Here are people who have left a situation of great danger with no desire but to build a life together and offer their children a future. They are already making a contribution to our country. And, as you can see by the wall in back of them, they know how to celebrate!
