BLACK HISTORY MONTH - at Washington School for Girls

Washington School for Girls recent held their annual "Blacks in Wax Museum" celebrating Black History and present-day history makers such as these remarkable women:



Ketanji Brown Jackson: the first Black woman to be confirmed as a U.S. Supreme Court Justice, bringing her extensive legal experience and a fresh perspective to the nation's highest court.



Ida B. Wells: A fearless journalist and activist, who exposed the horrors of lynching in the United States through her groundbreaking investigative reporting in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, risking her life to advocate for justice.



Fannie Lou Hamer (below left): A former sharecropper turned civil rights icon, who captivated the nation with her powerful testimony at the 1964 Democratic National Convention, demanding voting rights for African Americans despite facing violence and intimidation.

Josephine Baker (right): A dazzling performer who took Paris by storm in the 1920s, who not only redefined entertainment with her iconic banana-skirt dance but also spied for the French Resistance during World War II and later fought for civil rights in the U.S.



Lena Horne: Known for her sultry voice and striking beauty, Lena Horne broke barriers as a Black entertainer in Hollywood during the 1940s, using her platform to challenge racial stereotypes and advocate for civil rights.



WASHINGTON DC ARCHDIOCESE - Celebrates Its Jubilarians

Their jubilee year had just begun, when two "Diamonds" were invited to celebrate with other religious in the Washington Archdiocese on February 9.

Jubilarians Margaret Perron and Eileen Reid joined other men and women religious marking 25, 40, 50, 60 and 70 years of profession for the liturgy presided over by Cardinal Wilton Gregory.





Unlike other years, when the celebration took place at the Pastoral Center, St. Bernard's Parish Church in Riverdale, MD was the site of the gathering.

The jubilarians and their community members (Srs. Mary Bourdon, Rosemary Mangan and Janet Stolba represented the RJM) joined St. Bernard's parishioners at the 10am Mass. The parish includes a large Portuguese-speaking community, and the prayers alternated between English and Portuguese. Each jubilarian received a copy of <u>Dilexit Nos</u>, the Encyclical of Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart.

In January of this year, Pope Francis announced that he was accepting the resignation of Washington, DC's Cardinal Wilton Gregory, and appointing Cardinal Robert W. McElroy as his replacement.

Cardinal Gregory, who has served in Washington since 2019, was the first African-American to be made a Cardinal.

Cardinal McElroy comes to Washington after 10 years in San Diego, where our sisters greatly appreciated his leadership in the ministry to immigrants and in promoting synodality. He will be installed on March 11 in a ceremony at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception.


PILGRIMAGES OF HOPE FOR CREATION
