
PROVINCIAL CHAPTER HELD IN ATTLEBORO, MA

THE PRAYER I TURN TO

We are continuing our series of *The Prayer I Turn To*, with an additional prayer from Sr. Janice Farnham.

Ever since I was small, music has been a precious part of my life. It is a daily need and sustenance, especially when I take time to be with God, or listen to the music of nature, of the Scriptures, of God's silence. The first song I learned at four was a hymn my Dad taught me, "Abide With Me." I still hold it very dear, especially now that "fast falls the eventide" describes this phase of my life-journey.

But more than anything, funnily, it's old love songs that have opened my heart and invited me to new depths of intimacy with the Lord. About twenty years ago, at a conference on the Exercises at Fairfield University, I was walking to a session, feeling tired and resistant to going. Somewhere within me, I heard a voice sing lines from "Annie's Song," of John Denver:

Come, let me love you, let me give myself to you; let me drown in your laughter, let me die in your arms. Let me lie down beside you, let me always be with you; Come, let me love you – come love me again."

It was as if Jesus was singing this to me, and inviting me to sing it to him. I was overwhelmed, wondering "where did this come from, and why"? But I realize now that it's at the very heart of the Gospel, and of God's amazing creation, begun and sustained by Love. I think it's what Claudine heard in her broken heart as she came down from her Calvary Hill. Isn't it what God


