In their more than 200 years of existence, RJMs have worked to carry out this mission, keeping in mind Claudine's words to her first companions when she asked them to prioritize "the most poor, the most miserable, those who have the most troubles; those you will love a great deal."




The RJM Sisters in the USA Province felt the inspiration of these words when they voted unanimously in 1996 to begin a mission in Haiti.

The RJM Mission has provided education, healthcare, housing for elderly and disabled parishioners, food for the hungry, training in sustainable agriculture, programs for repairing the environment, and so much more in Haiti while forming loving relationships with the local communities. A key to the work done by the RJM Sisters and volunteers is an emphasis on seeing God in all things and all people. Courageous women like Sister Jackie Picard and Sister Pat Dillon have provided expertise in leading ministries and they have formed and empowered Haitian women and men to join in the RJM charism of making Jesus and Mary known through servant-leadership within those ministries.

Even through violence and crises, such as the earthquake of 2010, the murder of RJM Sister Isa Solá, and the collapse of the national government, the RJM Sisters have continued to serve alongside the Haitian people and volunteers from different countries. However, recent events, including increased gang violence and the U.S. elimination and reduction of international aid programs, have created even more challenges for the people of Haiti and made the ministries of the RJM Mission all the more critical.

In the past year, many parts of the world, including Haiti, have experienced extreme suffering, economic decline, and insecurity.

The Religious of Jesus and Mary have remained steadfast in carrying on St. Claudine's work despite radical changes affecting many lives. With our prayers and support, the RJM Mission has not stopped responding to the spiritual and physical needs of the Haitian people.
